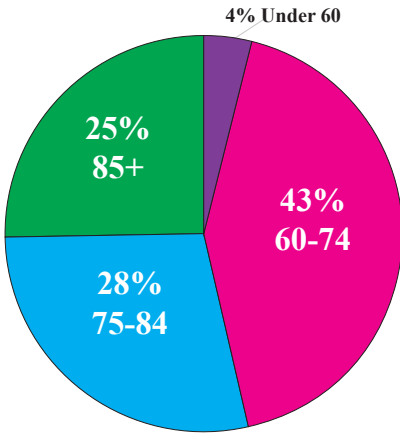

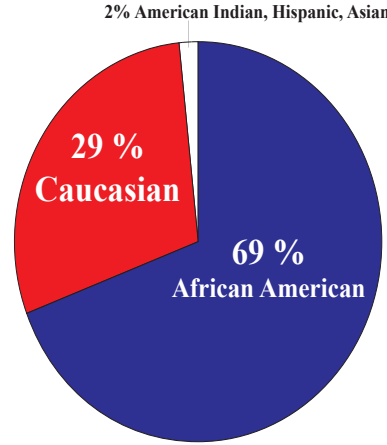

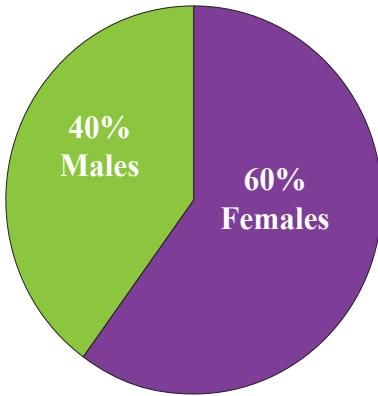
Clients By Age



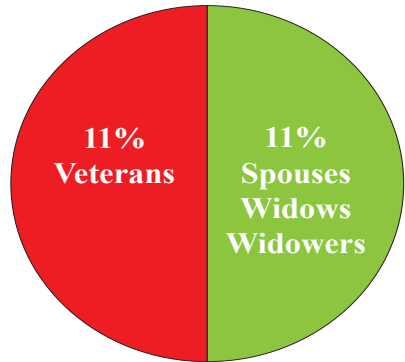
Clients By Ethnicity

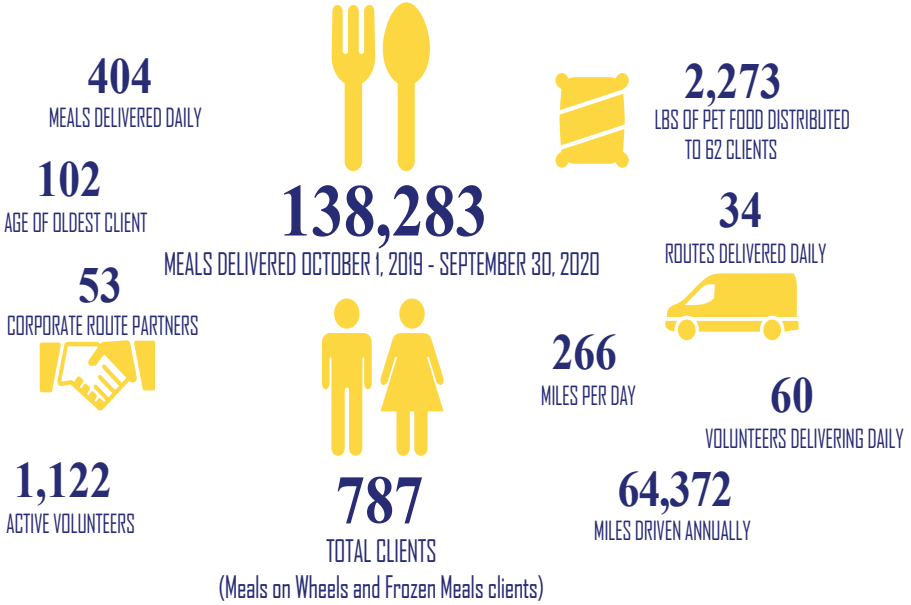


When COVID-19 began in 2020, MACOA started to face financial uncertainty. We knew we had to continue our mission because so many seniors and their families were depending on us. We wrote COVID-19 Relief grants and many were awarded. This dramatically increased our revenue so we could continue to provide meals as well as additional resources such as hygiene, non-perishable foods and health items to help support seniors during the pandemic. We also obtained a Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan/grant which ensured we were able to keep all MACOA employees on the payroll. In addition to the grants and the PPP, we are very appreciative of the many individuals, churches, and business partners who stepped up to help. Thanks to our community, we were able to make a real difference in the lives of our clients.

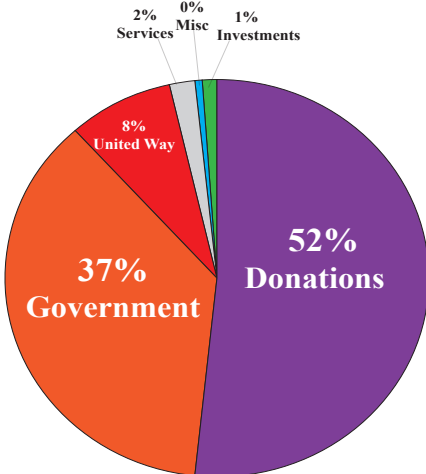

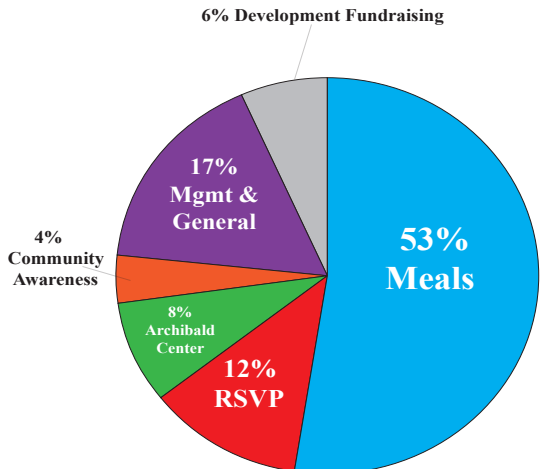

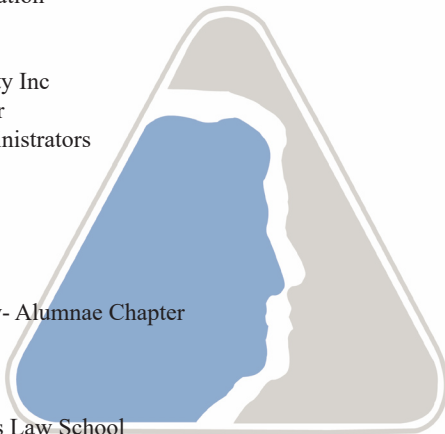

THE IMPACT OF RSVP

MACOA sponsors the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) for Autauga, Coosa, Elmore, Montgomery and Tallapoosa Counties. RSVP recruits volunteers for eight areas of service: Healthy Futures, Veterans and Military Families, Education, Environmental Stewardship, Community Priorities, Economic Opportunity, Donations Management, and Disaster Services. In the five counties 44% of the RSVP volunteers serve in the primary focus area Healthy Futures. These volunteers deliver Meals on Wheels, prepare and package frozen meals, provide transportation to doctor visits, the pharmacy, and grocery stores for homebound seniors. The volunteer also provide companionship to homebound and respite to caregivers. RSVP volunteers demonstrated tremendous impact in 2020 even with COVID-19. Volunteers came up with very creative ways to provide companionship, such as Facetime, emails and texts, visiting through screen doors and many, many, phone calls.

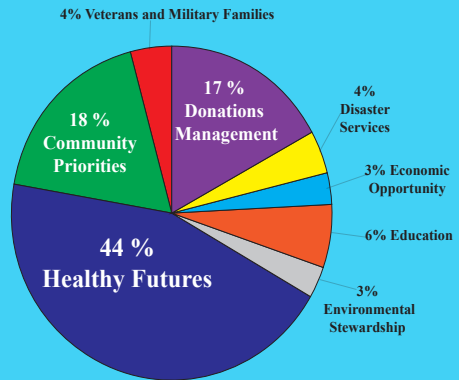

Each year, beginning in the summer months, donations of groceries and hygiene products from over 70 donors (individuals, businesses, schools, churches, civic groups and more) are collected for the Annual MACOA Holiday Bags Project. In December, our Meals on Wheels clients receive a large brown bag of the donated grocery items and a hygiene tote bag valued at \$100 per bag in order to sustain them during the holiday season. After the bags are packed, volunteers from around the community, including elected officials, business owners, and first responders deliver the Holiday Bags to bring a smile to the seniors during the holiday season.
